Scenario	Controls	Further Actions
Not social distancing pre and post-paddle	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Enforce 2m distance and groups of 6 pre & post-paddle● Ask paddlers to arrive ready to paddle● Ask paddlers to change at home where possible	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Signage to remind members to keep distance● Ask paddlers to avoid congregating around hut/container
Not cleaning surfaces	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Frequent cleaning & disinfecting of objects & surfaces that are touched regularly, such as door handles and light switches in areas such as the containers, toilets, gear storage area of hut.● Leave doors open to reduce contact with handles and improve ventilation	
Not cleaning club equipment	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Avoid sharing equipment between members in one session● Club equipment should be wiped down either soap and water (soft material) or dettol surface cleaner (boats, paddles, helmets)● Club equipment to be quarantined for 72 hours in storage	
Not washing hands or not washing them adequately	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Members encouraged to carry personal sanitizer● Hand sanitizer station available outside the hut door● Appropriate number of waste bins with lids for discarded tissues/hand towels● Frequent monitoring and resupply as necessary	

<p>Common use high traffic areas such as toilets, changing rooms, entry/exit points</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Only one person in male/female toilets at a time ● Toilet doors left open ● Changing facilities not available 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Consider one-way system for the two main pinch points (hut door and container)
<p>Rescues</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Avoid rescues where possible by paddling well within capability ● Consider activities and games played to reduce the likelihood of capsizing ● Members to wear face covering around neck whilst on the water in case of necessary close contact 	
<p>Close contact in boat (e.g pairs in open boats/tandem kayaks)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Avoid sharing boats outside of household ● If required, consider wearing PPE 	
<p>Provision of first aid</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Control measures to reduce likelihood of an incident ● Members advised to bring a mini first-aid kit and be self sufficient 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Brief club first responders with government guidance ● Provide mini “self-service” first aid kits for members
<p>Coaching on & off water</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Avoid raised voices ● Work in smaller groups where possible 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Recap of hand signals
<p>Travel and shuttles</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Avoid shared transport outside of households ● If unavoidable, minimise time in vehicles, and take precautions such as opening windows and wearing masks ● Follow government travel advice 	
<p>At risk members</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Ensure that participants understand the risks and discuss their individual needs and communicate to those who need to know
